1. What is the research study about?

You and your child are invited to take part in this research study. The research study aims to improve understanding of Australian student experiences with, and understanding of, beach hazards. Moreover, this research provides an opportunity for input into a beach safety education presentation designed by Lake Macquarie City Council lifeguards and researchers from the UNSW Beach Safety Research Group. The ultimate goal of this work is to improve high school beach safety education in order to prevent accidents from happening at the beach.

2. Who is conducting this research?

Research Funder: This research is being funded by the University of New South Wales and Lake Macquarie City Council (LMCC).

3. Inclusion/Exclusion Criteria

Before you decide to allow your child to participate in this research study, we need to ensure that your child is eligible to take part. The research study is looking to include students who meet the following criteria:

- 1. 11 years of age or older (Year 7 and above)
- 2. Student enrolled in and attending an Australian school

Children who meet the following criteria will be excluded from the study:

1. Under the age of 11 or in Year 6 or below.

4. Do I have to take part in this research study?

Participation in this research study is voluntary. If you or your child do not want to take part, you/they do not have to. If you or your child agree to take part and later change your/their mind, you/they are free to withdraw from the study at any stage.

If you/your child decide to take part in the research study, you will be asked to:

- Read the information carefully (ask questions if necessary);
- Sign and return the consent form if you decide to participate in the study;
- Take a copy of this form with you to keep.





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5. What does participation in this research require, and are there any risks involved?

If you agree for your child to participate your child will be asked to complete the following research procedures.

Focus Group: All focus group sessions will take place at your child's school during Physical Education class and will take approximately 50 minutes (one class period). During the focus group your child will be asked questions about their experience at the beach and their opinions on a beach safety education presentation for high schoolers. With your permission the research team would like to audio record the interview.

Psychological Distress: Although very unlikely, your child may feel that some of the questions we ask are stressful or upsetting (should they recall a discomforting event they experienced at the beach). If they do not wish to answer a question, they may skip it and/or stop at any time. The focus group sessions will be conducted in the presence of an educator from your child's school, who will be able to direct your child to the appropriate school resources if necessary.

6. What will happen to information about me?

By signing the consent form, you consent to the research team collecting and using information about/from you or your child for the research study.

The research team will store the data collected from you or your child for this research project for:

• A minimum of 5 years after the publication of the research results;

The information about you or your child will be stored in a:

- Non-identifiable format where your identity and your child's identity will be unknown.
- Information collected from you or your child in an electronic format will be stored on a UNSW password protected OneDrive that is only accessible to the approved research investigators.
- Information collected from you or your child using paper-based measures will be stored in Room 323, Level 3, of the Samuels Building on the UNSW Kensington Campus, and only the approved research investigators will have access to this information.
- Audio recording of the focus group will be stored on a UNSW password protected OneDrive only
 accessible to the approved research investigators. Audio recording will be made available to a
 professional transcription service. Recordings will only be made available after a confidentiality
 agreement with the professional transcription service has been signed.
- The information you or your child provides is personal information for the purposes of the Privacy and Personal Information Protection Act 1998 (NSW). You or your child have the right of access to personal information held about you/them by the University, the right to request correction and amendment of it, and the right to make a complaint about a breach of the Information Protection Principles as contained in the PPIP Act. Further information on how the University protects personal information is available in the <u>UNSW Privacy Management Plan</u>.

7. How and when will I find out what the results of the research study are?

The research team intend to publish and report the results of the research. All Information will be published in a way that will not identify you or your child.





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If you or your child would like to receive a copy of the results you or your child can let the research team know by inserting an email or mailing address in the consent form. We will only use these details to send the results of the research.

8. What if I want to withdraw from the research study?

If you do consent for your child to participate, you or your child may withdraw at any time. You or your child can do so by completing the 'Withdrawal of Consent Form' which is provided at the end of this document or you or your child can email the research team and tell them you no longer want to participate. The decision not to participate or to withdraw from the study will not affect your or your child's relationship with UNSW Sydney or any of the organisations involved in this research including your child's school and Lake Macquaire City Council. If you or your child decide to leave the research study, the researchers will not collect additional information from you. You or your child can request that any identifiable information about you or them be withdrawn from the research project.

9. What if I have a complaint or any concerns about the research study?
